# The 2022 Awards Funding a Wide Range of Activities



With a £1000 of funding from the CIO, the Community Environmental Educational Therapy (CEET) CIC run by Sarah Jellard has been busy organising lots of activities including gardening, paddle boarding, litter picking, allotment yoga and paddle boarding, building dens, learning about bats and moths, woodland conservation, local litter picking, visiting the Northam Burrows countryside centre and making fires to toast marshmallows. The CEET looks to help pupils with additional needs from Pilton.

### **Bluecoat Raised Bed Restoration**

Prompted by the excellent work already being done with **Pilton Bluecoat Academy** by Pilton resident Simon Hernon, who has been hosting groups of pupils on his allotment during 2022, the CIO has awarded Bluecoat £348 towards a project to restore some existing raised beds in the school courtyard and purchase a mini greenhouse for growing plants. Simon will be working with one of the year groups to sow seed, produce seedlings, plant these in existing raised beds, and harvest the vegetables for consumption in the school. This is a starter project with the aim of restoring an existing woodland area adjacent to the school fields.
